295-317 Lowerhouse Lane, Burnley, Lancashire, BB12 6LZ



Row of 12 cottages. c1850-80, for Dugdale's Lowerhouse Mill. Watershot coursed squared sandstone (No.305 rendered, Nos 297 and 307 rendered and painted white, and Nos 299, 303, 313 and 315 painted) slate roof with stone chimneys.

Double-depth plan, each cottage single-fronted with 2 storeys and 2 windows (one window each storey), with a continuous moulded gutter cornice sloping downwards from right to left. Doorways to the right, all tall and segmental-headed, with plain surrounds and recessed altered doors with overlights.

Those at Nos 297, 299, 307 and 315 with original dentilled lintels; segmental-headed windows on both floors, all with raised sills, plain surrounds and altered glazing. The row has a complete set of 12 corniced stone "2-pot" chimneys on the ridge.

Forms group with Nos 274-298 and 304-8 on the opposite side of the road.
